09/09/2021 ITS SIDS *Virtual Could change per DCDEE regulations	Infant/Toddler Safe Sleep and Sudden Death Syndrome Risk Reduction in Childcare. Mandatory for caregivers of children 0-12 months every 3 years				
09/16/2021 Deep Breathing: A Connection to Calm *Virtual	This training is geared towards informing, assessing, and providing strategies to support the skill of deep breathing and making the connection to help children learn how to calm. Participants will assess their own responses and reactions in relation to deep breathing by creating an environment that naturally promotes this crucial skill to early social-emotional development. They will learn about the importance of and evidence-based research on why breathing with children matters. This training will provide you with the understanding of your relationship with yourself, your children, and your teaching team/s.				
09/28/2021 What Every Baby Needs *Virtual	Infancy is an amazing time for babies. It might appear that all they do is cry, eat, sleep, and require frequent diaper changes. But there is so much more happening. Babies learn they will be fed when they are hungry and comforted when they are tired. They make discoveries about how the world works through their play experiences with simple toys. Understanding what every baby needs during the early years will help set the				

	stage for lifelong learning and development. This training will explore how to provide respectful and responsive care that will help shape the infant's brain and capacity to learn. Participants will learn about age-appropriate toys that stimulate learning for infants and how their freedom to move impacts their motor development.

Generally, children use negative behavior when they lack the skills that would help them meet their needs. Teachers who take time to assess the reason for misbehavior are better able to teach children new social-emotional skills. This session focuses on the common reasons that children misbehave, a crucial first step in determining how to prevent/reduce challenging behaviors.

This session focuses on modifications teachers can make in six key areas of the environment that will prevent and reduce conflict that leads to challenging behaviors

03/17/2022 Supporting Developmental Monitoring and Screening in Early Care and Education Settings *Virtual	We know that monitoring and screening in early childhood early care and education settings is critical to identifying children at risk for developmental delays. What is less known is how programs use developmental monitoring and screening tools and ways caregivers talk with families about their children's growth and development. This training will help participants understand the differences in developmental monitoring and screening and why they are so important to children and families. Participants will learn how they can track and celebrate children's milestones and strategies for collaborating with families on supporting children's healthy growth. 04/05/2022 Caregiving Routines: A Major Component of the Curriculum for Infants and Toddlers In-Person	What does the word "curriculum" mean to you? If teaching skills and planning projects are the first ideas that come to mind, then this training event will open your eyes to a new way of thinking about infant-toddler "curriculum". Infant and toddler teachers spend a large part of the day engaged in routine caregiving responsibilities. These are key learning times! Participants will understand why routines are essential to the "curriculum" and discover strategies to carry out daily routines that deepens the teacher-child relationship and promote infant and toddler development. This training provides information that supports the ITERS-R subscales: Personal Care Routines, Listening and Talking, Interactions and Program Structure.
04/12/2022 Toxic Stress and Its Impact on Children *Virtual	Stress is a fact of life, no matter your age. Some stress is good for us – it keeps us attentive, sharp, productive, and learning. But Toxic Stress affects brain development and learning in young children, and can have long-lasting effects. This session will help participants define stress responses and understand the difference between "tolerable" and "toxic" stress. We'll look at the long-term effects of Toxic Stress and investigate practices for mitigating those effects and promoting resilience in young children.
